




Damages to key economic sectors

HOW CAN BUSINESS COMMUNITIES CONTRIBUTE?

At minimum, companies should...

... and later, should evaluate:

Pledge

Leadership level pledge to reach net zero by 2050 or earlier

Plan

Explain the steps taken toward achieving net zero and set interim targets

Proceed

Take immediate actions, consistent with delivering interim targets specified


Publish

Commit to report progress, at least annually

- Short-and-medium term emission reduction targets, aligning with corporates' growth plan
- Absolute or intensity-based emission reduction targets
- Targets alignment with science-based goals
- Scope 3 inclusion and our plan of engagement
- Reliance on carbon offsets and carbon capture and sequestrations (CCS)
- Governance structure to incentivize climate actions



THROUGH ASEAN NET ZERO HUB, ASEAN BAC ORCHESTRATES VOLUNTARY INITIATIVES FROM COMPANIES



Country-specific according to jurisdiction, e.g., disclosure requirements in Japan, EU and UK

Global-scale standard setting bodies, e.g., International Sustainability Standards Board (ISSB)

ASEAN Net Zero Hub

Steering various voluntary initiatives from companies, encouraging adoption from globally acknowledged standards

Voluntary net zero initiatives, either from individual companies or industry-led, adopting global standards according to companies' state

Country Platform



In Indonesia, KADIN Net Zero Hub established in 2021 acts as the country platform

KADIN Net Zero Hub is established to enable Indonesian companies to start their net zero leadership

70 companies joining NZH

30 companies incubated for their climate targets

40 companies attended GHG bootcamp

6 companies registered its commitment to SBTI

Industry-led Platform



ASEAN BAC and JETRO MoU is the first industry-led platform

With offices across ASEAN Member States, JETRO is an important partner for industrial decarbonization

It is also important to encourage industrial decarbonization to the supply chain partners for Japanese companies



JETRO CAN PLAY A KEY ROLE IN ADVANCING CORPORATE NET ZERO, ESPECIALLY FOR LOCAL SUPPLY CHAINS



DRIVING AMBITIOUS CORPORATE CLIMATE ACTION

- 228 Japanese large companies committed to SBTi
- 321 Japanese SMEs committed to SBTi

- One of key elements of SBTi is supply chain engagement to mitigate Scope 3 emissions
- Partnership with JETRO to encourage supply chain engagement between Japanese companies and local supply chain
- Encouraging supply chain partners to commit to SBTi as part of the sustainable procurement practices
- Promoting climate solutions and technologies to enable industrial decarbonization journey
- Unlocking support from financial institutions to finance industrial decarbonization
